## Drivers ... let's be careful out there — it's back-to-school time



With students heading back to school next week, Hickam Air Force Base is reminding drivers to use extreme caution as many students will be walking or riding their bikes to and from school.

Drivers can expect large numbers of students going to school beginning just before 7 a.m. and running through 8 a.m.;

after-school traffic will wind down after 3:30 p.m.

"I can't emphasize enough the importance of drivers to be on the lookout for children as they are walking or riding their bikes to school," said Darren Dean, 15th Mission Support Group school liaison. "There is always an adjustment period when classes resume."



Drivers should also be aware that some bus routes and bus stops have changed since last year.



There are many students who are new to Hickam AFB and are not familiar with the traffic patterns.

The best advice I can give is for drivers to slow down and give themselves more time to get to their destination. The extra time is certainly worth avoiding accidents," said Mr. Dean

Parents and their students should map out the safest route to school together, including any alternate

routes. Parents should discuss proper safety practices with their children including how to use crosswalks and proper bicycle safety.

Parents are encouraged to have children wear bright clothing to increase visibility for drivers.

Children should not walk to school wearing headphone or playing portable video games because this makes it difficult for them to hear the traffic around them.

## HCH crews steer Earhart Phase I-2 toward completion; Onizuka Phase II-1 underway

Hickam Community Housing will play host to a town hall meeting-style presentation on historic renovation for all base residents on Monday from 6 to 7:30 p.m. at the HCH Community Center. In a press release, HCH officials encouraged frank and honest feedback from residents, and stressed that all officer field and NCO field residents are welcome at the event.

The event will also give HCH officials an opportunity to get base residents up to speed on residential construction progress here on base.

According to Actus Lend Lease construction manager John Kam, hundreds of workers representing nearly every trade in Hawaii are working hard and fast to get Air Force families into new homes.

"Our management team in the field is extremely fortunate to work with so many skilled tradesmen who share in our dedication to supporting families," he said. "They

set high standards in each of their respective trades to ensure a quality product and work with a great deal of professionalism."

Mr. Kam added that, to date, more than 180 homes have been completed in Earhart Village Phase I-2 and he anticipates that this phase will be completed by month's end with the turnover of 68 new homes.

Meanwhile, work has already started on Earhart Phase I-3.

"It's expected the first 20 homes in this phase will be turned over by the end of August," he said.

Another notable event taking place this month is the pouring of concrete slabs in the Onizuka housing area (Phase II-1).

"At this point things really start to take shape — framing, insulation, walls and other infrastructure, and the momentum builds from there," said Mr. Kam.

HCH expects 104 new company-grade officer (CGO) and field-grade officer (FGO) homes during the first quarter of 2009.

HCH thanks residents in advance for their patience as restoration work on the first 14 of 24 Select historic homes gets underway.

"HCH is working closely with development and construction teams to minimize the impact to residents," said HCH project director David Falls. "On-site work will not start until after 7:30 a.m. and crews should wrap-up by 4 p.m."

Mr. Falls added that the renovation of homes built in 1939 and 1941 is one of the largest historic communities to be renovated in the country.

The Select historic homes are a distinctive element of the neighborhood and will be restored close to their original state, but with modern amenities. Otherwise, the majority of the

homes in the historic area will have varying degrees of rehabilitation. Upon completion, residents moving into these homes will enjoy a wide variety of modern amenities.

HCH's Property Management team will work closely with residents who recently received a 120-day notice to vacate the second group of Select historic homes, required in order to meet the development schedule committed to the Air Force.

"These families will be a priority on our waiting list and will be relocated within the Hickam community," said Mr. Falls. "Our staff will do its best to ensure a smooth transition for families."



### FITNESSTIPS

Exercise: Barbell overhead press  
Primary muscle group: Shoulders

START

**Preparation:** In a standing or seated position, grasp barbell with a slightly wider-than-shoulder-width grip. Hold the barbell level with the shoulders or slightly below the chin, forming a 90-degree bend in the elbow.

**Execution:** Press barbell overhead without locking the elbows and look straight ahead. Lower the barbell to starting position.

**Note:** Perform 8-12 reps to build muscle, 15-20 reps to increase muscle endurance, and 1-4 reps to increase strength.





## Team Hickam History

The Air Force's most historic airfield

**July 27, 1951** — Lt. Gen. Laurence S. Kuter, Commanding General of Military Air Transport Service (MATS), arrives at Hickam. The stop here was part of a round-the-world inspection of MATS facilities that included Johnston Island AB and Kwajalein Atoll. General Kuter would return to Hickam as commander of the newly created Pacific Air Forces on July 1, 1957.

**July 29, 1975** — The first two military working dogs assigned to Hickam AFB arrive from Kadena AB, Japan, and stay in the State Quarantine facility pending completion of a mandatory 120-day quarantine period and establishment of a permanent facility on Hickam AFB.

**July 31, 1982** — The Royal Air Force Detachment, a long-time tenant at Hickam AFB,

closes down its operation and returns to Great Britain.

**July 31, 1992** — From July 23 to 31, 1992, the PACAF Inspector General conducts a Unit Effectiveness Inspection of the 15th Air Base Wing.



**July 26, 2003** — Hickam AFB Services holds a grand opening for the newly built, \$9.5-million Tradewinds Enlisted Club. Located across base from the old enlisted club (which was in the original enlisted residential area), the new state-of-the-art Air Force club featured the popular J.R. Rockers Sports Bar and contained 55,000 sq. ft. of covered areas and gardens. The club also included J.R. Rockers' Video Arcade Game parlor, complete with the latest in action video games.
