"The closest McDonalds when I was in high school was 36 miles away," he said. "After high school I spent a year working in a car parts factory in Sterling Heights and a friend — and I didn't know what a good friend he was at the time — told me I had to get out or stay stuck ... just settle into the job I'd have for the rest of my career."

"The only regret I have about joining the Air Force is that I didn't do it sooner. I have been fortunate. The NCOs at my first duty station — Master Sgt. Underhill, Master Sgt. Rollins, Tech. Sgt. Lattimer and Tech. Sgt. Irons — took me under their wing and taught me to take ownership and pride in whatever I do. That was the foundation of my career."

That appears to be a pretty solid foundation, according to Maj. Timothy M. Telega, 15th Services Squadron commander.

"Sergeant Nicaise is one of our sharpest Airmen," he said. "He exudes confidence and is well respected by his peers and superiors among whom he is known as the Services expert. Supporting the mission — in garrison and down range — has always been his focus."



Team Hickam History

The Air Force's most historic airfield

November 5, 1934 — Lt. Col. Horace Meek Hickam, a distinguished aviation pioneer, is killed when his Curtiss A-12 open-cockpit aircraft struck an obstruction during night landing practice on the unlighted field at Fort Crockett in Galveston, Texas. He was buried at Arlington National Cemetery. Six months later, Hickam Field in Hawaii was dedicated and named in his honor.

November 2, 1968 — The first men to circle the moon — Apollo 8 astronauts, Air Force Col. Frank Borman, Navy Capt. James A. Lovell Jr., and Air Force Mar. William A. Anders, splash down at 10:51 a.m., approximately 1,000 miles southwest of Hawaii, thus concluding their historic lunar orbit mission. The crew arrived at Hickam on Dec. 28, 1968, en route to the Manned Spacecraft Center in Houston, Texas. They received a large and festive welcome (including leis, grass-skirted hula girls, and many high-ranking civilian and mil-

itary officials among the some 10,000 persons on hand to greet them) as they set foot on American soil for the first time since their liftoff from Florida.



November 1, 1971 — The 15th Air Base Wing is activated and stationed at Hickam and assigned to Pacific Air Forces. Col. Ernest W. Pate assumed command of the Wing effective 1 November 1971.

November 6, 2004 — The Hawaii Air National Guard conducts a pinning ceremony for Brig. Gen. Peter S. Pawling, commander of the Hawaii Air National Guard 154th Wing, in the HIANG Hangar 3400 at Hickam. To receive his first star, Brig. Gen. Pawling was joined by Hawaii Governor Linda Lingle, Maj. Gen. Robert Lee, HIANG Adjutant General, and Brig. Gen. Darryll Wong, HIANG commander and chief of staff, along with other members of Team Hickam.

Exercise: Lying (prone) leg curl
Muscle: Legs (hamstrings)



- From start position, align knees with axis of rotation, placing the foot pad where it is most comfortable. To reduce excessive force on the knees, bring foot pad as high as can be tolerated.
- Maintaining a neutral spine, keep your head straight down and forward, flexing knees towards the buttocks as far as can be controlled.
- Lower the weight slowly to control rep tempo.
- Complete steps until you've reached the desired number of reps.
