

HICKAM AIR FORCE BASE — Team Hickam proudly recognizes Master Sgt. Marvin C. Frazier of the 15th Contracting Squadron as our Warrior of the Week!

Sergeant Frazier, originally from San Antonio, Texas, has been in the service for nearly 20 years and plans to retire within the next 15 months.

He said he enlisted in the Air Force to "travel, obtain education, develop a sense of independence and serve something greater than myself."

His favorite part of working as an Air Force contract specialist, is "being able to spend a lot of money and work in teams on contract issues," he said.
Just this week, he was working on contract worth \$500,000.

"You've really got to get the details right," he remarked as he leafed through the pages.

He puts a good deal of thought into his work, complimented his commander, Lt. Col. Roger W. Phillips.

"Marvin is a methodical, detail-oriented warfighter with a big heart and extensive knowledge of the contracting career field," Colonel Phillips said. "He's a true force multiplier I can place anywhere and expect success!"

Sergeant Frazier said, "I owe the Air Force a debt of gratitude for allowing me to fulfill my educational pursuits and providing me opportunities to travel and meet people, which would otherwise not be possible, if I had remained back home."

He also credits Eddie West, his former flight chief at Cannon AFB, with showing him the importance of character. "I learned through Eddie's actions that a person's true character shows in times of difficulties versus in times of ease. He was a great role model who lived by his convictions and wasn't afraid to speak out."

Sergeant Frazier enjoys the islands for the "small-town feel with big city perks." He adds, though, that the base needs to expand the fitness center by adding more equipment and space.

"It's entirely too small for the number of patrons using the facility on a daily basis," he said.

He also suggests that given the conflicts overseas, the service "eliminate manpower cuts for the meantime, at least until the wars in Afghanistan and Iraq are under control."



Team Hickam History

The Air Force's most historic airfield

June 19, 1987 — During a command visit to Wake Island, 15th ABW Commander Colonel Timothy D. Gill formally dedicates a plaque reflecting Wake Island's designation as a National Historic Landmark.

June 20, 1920 — Army Captain Robert Olds flies the first-ever night flight over Oahu.

June 21, 1970 — The 535th Tactical Airlift Squadron is stationed at Cam Ranh Bay AB, South Vietnam from this date until 24 January 1972 (when it is inactivated).

June 23, 1981 — Secretary of State Alexander Haig visits Hawaii for a few days, primarily to rest

and relax. He arrived at Hickam via MAC C-137 and was quartered at Makalapa Kai by the Navy. Wing support included security and aircraft service.

June 25, 1980 — Captain Angelia Newsom becomes the first female Air Force officer assigned to Wake Island.

June 25, 1980 — Secretary of the Air Force Dr. Hans A. Mark visits Hickam AFB, Hawaii.

June 25, 1988 — Prime Minister Noboru Takeshita and his wife land at Hickam for a refueling stop en route back to Tokyo after an economic summit meeting in Canada.





Exercise: Trunk rotation Muscles Worked: Abdominal and obliques



START



FINISH

Begin standing back to back with another workout partner with one of the partners holding a medicine ball. Maintain neutral alignment, contract the abs and bend the knees slightly so that they do not lock out. The feet should be about shoulder width or more apart.

Both partners should twist to the same side. The partner with the medicine ball then hands off the ball to the next partner and then both partners will twist to the other side and pass the medicine ball again.

This will continue so that the ball will go in circles around both partners.
