



## Team Hickam History


The Air Force's most historic airfield

**June 26, 2003** — The 15 AW holds its last initial readiness response exercise (IRRE), as the wing began transitioning to its operational C-17 mission. Future evaluations would be operational readiness exercises.

**June 30, 1975** — The 501st Air Force Band, assigned to Hickam AFB since November 1947, inactivates.

**July 1, 1970** — Detachment 3, 6486th Air Base Wing, is activated at Johnston Island (S.O. G-94). Det. 3's mission was to command, operate, and maintain facilities on JI in support of the National Nuclear Test Readiness Plan; exercise operational

control of Pacific Air Forces activities; and to provide administrative and logistic support for defense and civil agencies assigned or attached to JI.



**July 1, 1973** — Military Airlift Command transfers responsibility for Wake Island to PACAF; and Detachment 4, 15 ABW is activated on Wake. On the same date, Detachment 3, 15 ABW, was inactivated and responsibility for management of Johnston Atoll transferred from USAF to the Defense Nuclear Agency.

**July 2, 1926** — The first known reforestation by airplane is carried out in Hawaii.




**Exercise: Hamstring curls**  
**Muscle group: Hamstrings (back of the leg)**

Begin by placing the heels on the center of the ball. Keep both legs straight and knees partially flexed. Place hands on the floor and maintain neutral alignment of the spine. Slowly flex the hamstrings and pull the ball toward the buttocks while forming a 90-degree bent on the knees. Pause for two counts, then return to starting position. Repeat 10 to 12 times for each set.
